Our role as co-mediators is to be neutral, non-judgmental and to maintain confidentiality throughout the process. As mediators, we will not take sides and we will listen fully to each point of view.

Now I want to talk a little bit about your role today. Your role as the parties will be to please be patient, flexible, and please listen to one another. We ask that you are respectful throughout the process and do not interrupt one another. We ask that you take the time to listen and think about the other party's point of view in order to find solutions, and to think creatively about ways we can resolve this case today.

Great. Now to begin, we would like to ask each of you to tell us what brought you to mediation today and tell us a little bit about your side of the story.
